## DIPLOMA OF PROJECT MANAGEMENT (AQF5) - BSB51407

### Course Overview

This course runs over 5 days beginning the 19th March and concluding the 23rd March. The cost of the workshop inclusive of materials and the final assessment \$3,700 (GST Free), the price also includes a light lunch.

Diploma of Project Management is a competency-based award at Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) Level 5. Competencies at the Diploma level describe the functions of a project manager who manages the work of project team members. Nine units of competency from the National Competency Standards for Project Management are required for the qualification.

### Who Should Attend

This course is designed for aspiring project managers and those who seek to reinforce the project management skills they have acquired on the job and obtain formal recognition.

### Course Prerequisites

There are no formal prerequisites for undertaking the course. However, this course is not considered entry level (i.e. direct from school), participants are expected to have reasonable levels of: language, literacy and numeracy, required of project managers and to be in a position to assemble the required portfolio of workplace evidence, to enable the final award to be granted.

### Course Outcomes

At the end of the course participants will have demonstrated skills and knowledge relevant to each of the nine competency areas of the Diploma of Project Management.

### Course Assessment

There is no formal examination in this course. Instead, participants demonstrate evidence of the required competencies throughout the course and are required to submit a series of 'In The Workplace' questions post the course. Assessment items consist of activities and exercises based on actual and simulated project management scenarios. A participant, who is assessed as competent in all nine knowledge areas and completes the workplace assessment evidence successfully (within 6 months of the workshop), will receive the Diploma of Project Management and may apply to be assessed concurrently for the AIPM's RegPM award (Keith O'Shea Director of QTC Consulting, is a registered assessor with AIPM). The Diploma level also assists in preparation for undertaking the PMI's PMP exam.
