Workshop Overview

Several recent public sector projects have been uncovered by auditors and by the media and severely criticised as delivering far too little benefit and not meeting projected outcomes, budgets or deadlines. The executives responsible for projects cannot avoid their responsibility for such loss and failure to deliver promised assets and services within promised/agreed parameters.

Current research shows that the majority of project failures are primarily caused by inadequate project management and in particular project governance. The majority of these failures can be attributable to the managers and executives at the head of the project decision tree.

Workshop Objectives

The overall aim of this workshop is to improve the management of both corporate and public sector projects by better informing and educating the key decision makers to implement better governance of the project planning and delivery processes as well as more efficient and effective monitoring, controlling and reporting.
